Dedication of the Monte Cassino Memorial in the National Memorial Arboretum, Alrewas

On a beautiful, sunny day in late May—one of the very few warm, dry days of this soggy wet summer, over one hundred and seventy joined together to dedicate the Memorial, amazingly twenty five of whom were our veterans. We were also joined by members of the public who, hearing the band, came to stand with us and joined in the service.

We processed to the memorial headed by the Pipes & Drums of The Black Watch Association, Stoke on Trent Branch, led by Drum Major Mr. A.E. Simmonds (a Cassino Veteran himself) and the Standard of the Medway Branch of the Royal Tank Regiment.

The simple, but moving service was led by the Rev. Prebendary Tony Wood, the lesson was

read by Lyn Anslow and the exhortation by Peter Wain. Our own Garth Wright, a Dunkirk veteran as well as a veteran of Cassino, played the Last Post and Reveille.

Incidentally, Peter was instrumental in designing the memorial and Steve Cartwright submitted the architectural drawings required by the Trustees of the Arboretum. After much deliberation by the Trustees we were eventually given the go ahead and Wilf and Martin Burt, local stonemasons from Stoke on Trent started building the Cairn in the most atrocious weather, often working in inches of water. Up until two weeks prior to the dedication we were not sure whether we would be able to hold the service on the 26th but fortune smiled on us and we were able to enjoy a splendid day in good company.

Fourth Culture Films — *Monte Cassino* A new feature film

2014 sees the 70th anniversary of the Battle of Monte Cassino and with it comes a new feature film, focusing on the failed American crossing of the Rapido River, the bombardment of the abbey and its eventual seizure by the Allied troops on 18th May 1944.

Long fascinated by this untold story, British filmmaker John Irvin will direct this motion picture from a screenplay by American historian Collin Scott. Well-known for over 40 titles, Mr. Irvin has earned critical acclaim for his war films, which perhaps most notably include *The Dogs of War* and *Hamburger Hill*. Steffen Wild of Fourth Culture Films and BAFTA-winning Davina Belling of Film & General Productions will produce this new theatrical feature film.

The upcoming production (working title: *Monte Cassino*) looks to honour those soldiers who fought this harrowing battle whilst also commemorating the sad destruction of an iconic monument. Telling this story for the first time on the big screen, the film will be a faithful, though dramatic, interpretation of the events, viewing the battle from various perspectives of the different nationalities that saw action at

Monte Cassino and in the Italian Campaign.

Casting is already underway, headed by double Emmy-Award winner Suzanne Smith, whose previous credits in this genre include HBO's *Band of Brothers* and *The Pacific*. The production plans to film in Central Europe in 2013 ready for release in cinemas in 2014.

To raise awareness of the project, film production company, Fourth Culture Films has teamed up with a number of individuals and organisations, including the Monte Cassino Society, to offer a range of promotions. These range from history books and signed DVDs to exclusive dinner tickets but also include memorial donations, membership subscriptions to the Monte Cassino Society and guided battlefield tours. Many of these special offers are unique and only available online from Friday 3rd August at indiegogo.com under the name: 'The Battle for Monte Cassino—Support the Untold Story'. A percentage of all proceeds will go towards the British Red Cross who the production company is working to support.

The production team is also committed to raising awareness of the battle itself and has been linking interest groups and interested individuals together on social media platforms in a commemoration of Monte Cassino. They aim to create an online community resource for this purpose with articles, websites, videos and photos as well as bringing the battle and its complexities to a wider audience. In addition to this, all the historical articles posted on these sites will be available in English, Italian and Polish.

The team will also be sharing its own material with the online community, including exclusive interviews, unseen archive footage, new articles and special Q&A sessions.
