Pilgrimage to Cassino

The response has been fantastic, more wishing to go to Italy than we had anticipated! Our numbers were dependent upon coaches needed for travel in Italy and once we had decided to book a second coach we were able to increase the number to what we have now—104 which includes 14 veterans. After that point it was impossible to cater for any more; there is now a reserve list.

Next year is a very significant anniversary and while some of us will be in Italy for the service in Cassino War

Cemetery, it is very likely that others will wish to mark the occasion at our Memorial in the National Memorial Arboretum in Alrewas.

Most of our veterans are unable to undertake the journey to Italy but many may wish to join with comrades and family to mark the event.

We would be grateful if someone was willing to oversee an informal service at the Arboretum on or near the 18th May 2014. Mike Anslow liaised with the staff at the Arboretum, organised the Service of Dedication of the Memorial in May last year and the Memorial Service this year. 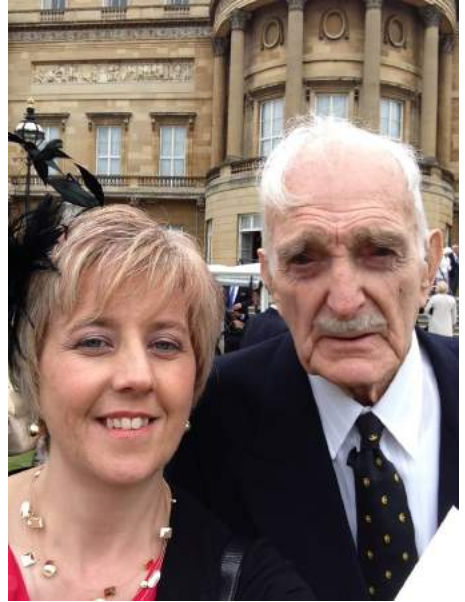
VISIT TO THE PALACE

Once in the garden they were served with tea, cucumber sandwiches and petite cakes while the band played.
